## Anti-JW Apologetic Nuggets

Their eschatology is also fatal in having the last generation commencing at Christ's *invisible* return in 1914!

Knowing only the above well is enough to seriously confound any Witness.

WT leaders claim Christ is in the "inner rooms" of the organisation.

The second presence of Jesus is claimed to have started in 1874.

Rutherford's followers insist Russell never claimed to be the "faithful and wise servant" of Mt 24.45-7.

JW's claim the "little flock" in Lk 12.32 are the 144,000 spirit-anointed believers that go to heaven, but the "other sheep" only receive everlasting life on Earth. Pre-Christian believers including all the prophets also miss out on heaven!

The NWT's "Jehovah" in Rm 14.7-9 confuses Jesus with the Father.

God refers to David in Ps 89.27 as his "firstborn", when he was Jesse's seventh son.
