A Catastrophic Atheist Apologist

A rabid anti-Christian, this hostile witness manages to provide great evidence for Biblical geology, which plainly is catastrophism.

After a robust preface denying anything he will say should be taken as incriminating evidence against the fantasy of millions of years of deep time and biological evolution, he proceeds to lay out said evidence.

Vertically stratified trees, folded mountains, flood-cut canyons, and fastforming coal beds are all documented, yet no secular answers are given (since there are none).

On biological evolution, there is nothing but Ager's faith, starting with a false dichotomy that it's either Darwinism or multiple special creations. He also incredibly states that statis (i.e., that the 'missing links' are all still missing!) is actually evidence *for* evolution. In his warped mind, absence of evidence is evidence of Evolution's presence.

His quotation from Sir Edward Bailey (Geological Society of London, 1953) is apt; "To see a thing you have to believe it to be possible," and since Ager is blind to the Bible's history of what he sees in the rocks, he refused to believe it.

Waters travelled across the N-W at 45mph, from their source of the ice-dammed lake at Missoula in Montana (1,100 ft deep).
